



## Middle School Remote Learning Expectations

Updated 11/19/2020

Students who are home due to quarantine or illness, while well-enough to be on the computer, are responsible for the completion of their school work according to their normal class schedule. *Middle school students who learn remotely are expected to:*

- Have consistent access to the Internet and a reliable WiFi connection throughout the school day (7:35 am-2:40 pm).
- Have consistent use of a computer, with a **microphone and camera, throughout the school day (7:35 am-2:40 pm)**. If a computer isn't available from 7:35 am-2:45 pm, parents should arrange for a Google Chromebook to be checked out from the school. Chromebook checkout is managed during school hours through Mr. Tremel: [atreml@epiphanymn.org](mailto:atreml@epiphanymn.org).
- Additional coursework/assignments outside of the 7:35 am - 2:40 pm school day should be anticipated. This work will be determined by classroom teachers and subject matter.
- Log into Google Classroom by 7:35 am for morning announcements and homeroom. Daily attendance will be taken during homeroom; students not present will be marked absent. Should a student not be well enough to attend first period, parents should call the nurses line to report them absent due to illness: 763-754-1750 ext. 322.
- Log into subsequent classes according to the normal middle school schedule; attendance will be taken in each class.
- Dress appropriately for class: no hats, hoodies, or clothing with political statements.
- Attend Google Meets in designated learning spaces while at home (dining room/kitchen table, desks, etc.).
- Follow regular classroom procedures and rules during Google Meets: no eating, no cell phones or devices other than the one being used for remote learning, and no leaving the Google Meet without notifying the teacher.
- Adhere to the **expectations for classwork, due dates, and grading, which will be consistent with those for on-campus instruction**. Assessments and assignments completed during remote learning will be included in calculating grades. Formative and summative assessments will be completed in "real time".
