The schedule components promote the age-appropriate spiritual, physical, intellectual, social, and emotional development of preschool children. Students in our Preschool Program will begin by focusing on skills to increase their success in the school environment such as: advocating for oneself, building relationships, self-regulation, following instructions, and gaining independence in self-help skills such as zipping, buttoning, and snapping.

Students in our Prekindergarten Program will focus on skills to increase their success in Kindergarten such as academics and self-help skills: recognizing and printing letters and numbers, counting, phonics, one-to-one correspondence, classification, fine motor control, correct pencil & scissor grip, cutting, and following directions.
